

RESOLUTION SEEKING A STATE AND NATIONAL INQUIRY INTO PUBLIC HEALTH EFFECTS OF GEO-ENGINEERING ON CITIZENS OF THE TOWN OF PINE RIVER, LINCOLN COUNTY, WISCONSIN

WHEREAS the Town Board of Pine River, Lincoln County, Wisconsin, is charged with protecting the health and welfare of the citizens within its jurisdiction

WHEREAS this responsibility includes protecting our air, soil and water from the negative effects of chemical toxins on these vital elements of life

WHEREAS for over a decade concerned citizens of Lincoln County and throughout the nation and world have observed trails from jet aircraft labeled contrails, chemtrails or chaff

WHEREAS a Congressional committee has held hearings into the future policy of geo-engineering to counter "global warming"

WHEREAS The Encyclopedia of Global Change defines geo-engineering as: "Intentional large-scale manipulation of the global environment. Geo-engineering schemes seek to mitigate the effect of fossil-fuel combustion on the climate without abating fossil-fuel use; for example by placing shields in space to reduce the sunlight incident on the earth."

WHEREAS toxic chemical nano particles of aluminum, barium and strontium in excessive concentrations injurious to human health have been measured in such ecologically isolated areas as Mt. Shasta, California

WHEREAS the use of these toxic heavy metals in aerosols to mitigate the effects of "global warming" was suggested by Dyson in 1979 and Teller in 1997

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board of Pine River, Lincoln County, Wisconsin, seeks an inquiry by official government agencies into the current use of geo-engineering programs in our state and nation

THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution, with a DVD entitled "What in the World Are They Spraying?" be sent to the following entities: Wisconsin Division of Public Health, Division of Public Health/Northern Regional Office, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, U.S. Department of Defense, U.S. Air Force, President of the United States, Wisconsin Congressional and Senatorial representatives, Congressional Science Committee, U.S. Congressman Dennis Kucinich, Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, and the Lincoln County Clerk.
